

Lesson 1 - Anh L c taught tones & sounds. OÁT, O T, OÁC, O C, OÁCH, O CH, OÉT, O T, OÉC, O C, ON, NG. ([worksheet](#))

Lesson 2 - Anh B o taught us about composite words ([worksheet](#)). Good news: Because of composite words, your understanding of Vietnamese will accelerate faster than you ever thought possible! Class practised in smaller groups with instructors.

Some examples from students:

Xin i, anh có th nói i cho tôi? Excuse me, can you say that again for me?

Xin lỗi, tôi nói một ít Tiếng Việt. Excuse me, I speak a little Vietnamese.

Anh ở đây lâu chưa? (or) Anh ở đây bao lâu rồi? How long have you lived here?

Xin lỗi nếu tôi đánh thức anh dậy. I'm sorry if I woke you up.

Đồ ăn thơm quá! The food smells very good!

Lesson 4 - Anh Long taught tones & sounds. OAI, OM, ÓP, ỚP, ÓT, ỚT, NÓC, ONG, ÔNG, OAY, OEN & the difference between "S" & "X" ([worksheet](#))

Lesson 5 – Anh Long taught language structure. ([worksheets](#))

Anh Long explained that s + adjective/verb = noun.

We learnt about Affirmative Imperatives: đi, hãy.

We also learnt about Negative Imperatives: đừng, đừng.

When listening to Vietnamese at meetings or witnessing, take note of how many times you hear

"đi" & "hãy".
